

## The Olivier Awards

### Sustainability & Environmental Responsibility Statement

The Olivier Awards are committed to delivering a world-class celebration of excellence while minimising environmental impact and supporting a more sustainable events industry. Sustainability is embedded across the planning, production and delivery of all Olivier Awards activities, guided by the principles of **Reduce, Reuse and Recycle**.

This document outlines the measures in place across the Green Carpet Arrival, Ceremony and wider operational practices.

### Our Sustainability Principles

The Olivier Awards aim to:

- **Reduce** resource consumption, waste and emissions wherever possible
- **Reuse** materials, assets and infrastructure year-on-year
- **Recycle** responsibly, using sustainable materials and waste streams
- Support **clean energy, low-emission transport and local employment**
- Encourage sustainable choices among partners, attendees and suppliers

### Green Carpet & Arrival Experience

Sustainability considerations are integrated into the Green Carpet experience without compromising its visual impact or guest experience.

Key initiatives include:

- **Green Carpet installation**, incorporating fully sustainable grass alternative to carpet to reduce reliance on traditional single-use materials
- **LED lighting throughout**, reducing energy consumption and improving efficiency
- Use of **Royal Albert Hall green energy** to power event operations without use of a generator
- **Audi electric vehicle fleet** supporting artist and guest transportation
- **Reuse of branding boards, flags and signage** across multiple years wherever possible

### Ceremony & Production

The Olivier Awards Ceremony is designed with long-term sustainability and asset reuse at its core.

Key measures include:

- Use of **Royal Albert Hall green energy** to power the venue and ceremony

- **Electronic documentation** and use of tablets and laptops in place of printed materials wherever possible
- **Set design reused annually**, with recent refurbishment incorporating **fully LED lighting systems**
- **Yearly reuse of press boards and assets** (with new assets introduced for 2026 due to a change in partnership)
- **E-tickets and online guest information** replacing physical ticketing and printed packs
- Attendees **encouraged to travel via public transport** and to consider **sustainable fashion choices**
- All accreditation **printed on sustainable materials**
- Ceremony brochure **fully recyclable**, printed using **sustainable materials and environmentally responsible inks**
- **Script printing limited to essential copies only**, with recycling processes in place
- Guests to receive **reusable tote bag**

### General Operational Practices

Across all Olivier Awards events, including the Launch Event, Nominees' Celebration and Ceremony, the following sustainability practices apply:

- Use of **rechargeable electronic equipment** wherever feasible
- **E-invitations** issued for all events
- **No airline partner**, reducing unnecessary promotion of air travel
- **Water fountains backstage**, with reusable water bottles encouraged or provided to artists, presenters and crew
- **Employment of local staff and crew** to minimise travel-related emissions
- Ongoing engagement with **catering partners** to encourage responsible sourcing, waste reduction and sustainable food practices, aligned with supplier sustainability standards

### Continuous Improvement

The Olivier Awards recognise that sustainability is an ongoing process. We remain committed to reviewing our practices annually, working closely with venues, partners and suppliers to identify opportunities for further improvement and innovation.

Through responsible production, conscious decision-making and collaboration, the Olivier Awards aim to set a positive example for sustainable excellence within the cultural and live events sector.
